2 Course goals and objectives

Through examples from everyday life, students will learn the basics of statistical reasoning, data analysis, interpretation, and communication of the analysis results.

STAT:1010 is approved for General Education in the Quantitative and Formal Reasoning category.

3 Evaluation of students

3.1 Homework

Generally, homework will be assigned every Friday in ICON, and due in ICON the next Friday before class starts. The deadline will be clearly shown in ICON/Assignment. Please write clearly and upload a single file of scan/picture of your work in ICON/Assignment. Under any circumstances, homework submissions up to 24 hours late will receive a 25% penalty, those between 24 and 48 hours late a 50% penalty, etc. The lowest two homework scores will be dropped.

You are encouraged to study with others. But the submitted work must reflect your own effort.

If you do discuss with others on homework assignments, please: a) write up your own assignment and make sure you completely understand all solutions that you submit, and b) write the names of the others in your study group on your assignment. Simply copying another student's homework will be considered academic misconduct.

3.2 Discussions

Your TA will take attendance in discussion. This constitutes 10% of your grade. No exceptions will be made for illness, work conflicts, conferences, etc. You can miss two discussions without penalty.

3.3 Quizzes

Generally, an online (ICON) quiz will be given following lecture on Fridays. Students will have until the beginning of the next lecture on Friday to complete the quiz. Make-up quizzes will not be allowed. The lowest *two* quiz scores will be dropped.

3.4 Exams

There will be two midterm exams and one comprehensive 2-hour final. The midterms will be given in the classroom during a regular lecture period. Students may bring one $8-1/2 \times 11$ in. sheet of paper with notes to each midterm, and may bring three sheets to the final exam.
